A needs assessment supports schools to systematically examine system strengths and weaknesses. This allows leaders to understand key needs and prioritize actionable steps to improve outcomes for all students.

IMPROVEMENT PLANS

Does your school have an improvement plan for developing student reading outcomes? Does your board? If yes, describe the plan, how it translates to reading instruction, and how the effectiveness of the plan is evaluated.

TIERED INSTRUCTION

Instructional intensity varies depending on the tier of instruction or intervention. Describe tiered instruction at your school: what does instruction at each tier look like? How much instructional time is allocated to each tier? Does this instructional time overlap, or is it additive?



SCHOOL-WIDE ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

A cohesive assessment system plays a key role in driving student outcomes by informing instruction. What reading assessments are used in your school?

ANALYSING SCREENING DATA

Universal screening is a system of brief assessments given to every student to quickly and reliably understand risk for reading difficulty. Data from screening data don't just tell us about individual student risk, but they also allow us to understand the needs of a school and make good decisions.
